
Normal rules apply. You **MUST** adhere to these expectations **at all times**:

 - Either in class or on the Home Learning programme
 - Complete and submit **all** work on time.
- 11. Adhere to the Computer Usage policy.
 - Inappropriate use will lead to sanction and/or ban.
- 12. Give **100%** in every task, including enrichment.
