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MOCK EXAMINATION – RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

After half term, you will be completing the second formal mock examination in Religious Education in order to prepare you for the GCSE RE examination in the summer examination period.

The examination will take place on Monday 19th February 2024 and Wednesday 28th February

2024. The exam will take place during in the afternoon and instructions on the outline of the day will follow. Please be aware that on Monday 19th February 2024, students will be dismissed at approximately 2:15pm once they have completed their exam.

Please make sure you are fully prepared and equipped for the exam. No additional equipment will be given out under any circumstances.

- Ensure you are prepared for the exam by checking that you meet the GCSE equipment and conduct requirements.
- Bottles must be transparent with all labels or writing removed.
- All electronic devices, including watches, headphones and phones must be turned off and handed to exam supervisors.
- You are required to have a transparent pencil cases with a ruler, scientific calculator, eraser, protractor, compass, sharpener, pencil and two black pens.
- All exams must be completed in black pen only.
- No notes or paper of any kind are not permitted into the examination room.
- Speaking or any form of communication is not permitted once you have entered the examination room.
- You are required to be in full school uniform, including correct school shoes. Students with incorrect/poor uniform will not be permitted to enter the exam hall.

You must arrive on time and meet the Academy and external expectations around formal examinations. Failure to arrive to the Academy on time or to uphold the examination expectations, may result in you not being permitted to complete the examination.

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We hope this opportunity will provide you with the experience, motivation and focus required to perform to the best of your ability. You will receive an overall result and feedback from the mock examination, which will be vital in identifying next steps in order to make progress.
